

Present Simple

Used to talk about a habit, a routine, a scheduled event, or a general truth

Form

Subject + verb(infinitive) + (s/es for 3rd person)



Examples

I eat chocolate a lot. He goes to work by train. The meeting starts at 8 o'clock. Ireland have a brilliant football team.



l <mark>do not</mark> eat chocolate a lot. He <mark>doesn't</mark> go to work by train.

Does the meeting start at 8 o'clock? Do Ireland have a good football team?



Present Continuous

Used to talk about something happening now, a long action in progress, or something in the near future

Form Sul

Subject + be + verb(ing)



Examples

You are listening to me. The students are enjoying my webinar. Tom is studying in Trinity College. I'm visiting my parents this weekend. Negatives & Questions


You are not listening to me. ✓ You're not listening to me now.

✓ You aren't listening to me now.

Is Tom studying in Trinity College? Am I visiting my parents this weekend?



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These can't be used in Continuous Tenses They usually relate to thoughts, emotions, senses, and states of being

Need Want Believe Understand	I don't like surfing the web. We are driving to Paris for our vacation He is not wanting to go to the cinema. Do they believe in God? Mark is knowing all about English.	Play Run Laugh



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
How peanut butter is made

Irregular Past Participles

ground > to grind
put > to put



Their skin is now removed using water.



The peanuts are ground into butter by a big machine.







The butter is packed into jars and the labels are put on.
